McNutt, newly appointed coordinator of health and welfare relating to the national defense. The strategic importance of health has been recognized on the national scale not only through the appointment of Federal Security Administrator McNutt, but by the creation of a Health and Medical Committee in the Council of National Defense.

Dr. Irvin Abell, former president of the American Medical Association, is chairman of the committee. The other members are the surgeon general of the army, Major General James C. Magee; the surgeon general of the navy, Rear Admiral Ross T. McIntyre; the surgeon general of Public Health Service, Doctor Thomas Parran, and the chairman of the Division of Medical Sciences of the National Research Council, Doctor Lewis H. Weed.

Health defense is protection and development of our manpower—the basic resource of any defense. The nation's safety requires that the man in overalls be kept in the same pink of condition as the man in uniform.

General disease threatens these men. Among the 16,500,000 men registered under the Selective Service Act, for example, there is much communicable syphilis. In this group there are probably 300,000 men with infectious syphilis. Discovery and treatment of syphilis and gonorrhea among these young men would increase for the future the reservoir of healthy men available for efficient and active duty both in the armed forces and in industry.

To quote Surgeon General Parran of the U. S. Health Service: "Today we have a surplus of men. But we have no assurance that this condition will exist even a year from now. We must consider the health of our reserves."

"The job of treatment for those men not called for training and of those men in defense industries falls squarely on the shoulders of state and local health departments. They will need every support of governmental authorities and the entire civilian population."

Navy Recruiting At Murphy
A representative of the U. S. Navy Recruiting service will be at the postoffice building, Murphy, from March 3 to March 8, inclusive, from 9 a. m. to 4:30 p. m. daily, for the purpose of interviewing prospective candidates and receiving applications for enlistment in the U. S. Navy. An unlimited number of applications will be accepted, and those who meet the requirements may be sure of enlistment at an early date.

The basic requirements for enlistment in the U. S. Navy are that a man be between the ages of 17 to 31 inclusive, be unmarried, have not less than seventh grade education, and have the consent of his parents for enlistment. Attention is called to the fact that registration for selective service is not a bar to enlistment. Opportunities for advancement and promotion are much greater than have ever existed before.

It is further announced that application for flight training as an aviation cadet in Class V—Five, Naval Reserve, will be accepted. The requirements are that a man must be between the ages of 20 and 27, unmarried, and have completed two years of college. Those that qualify are offered a course of training in Naval Aviation that will eventually fit them for commissions as Ensigns in the Navy Reserve, with the title of Aviation Pilots.

Claude Evans, Jr., son of Mrs. Claude Evans and the late Claude Evans of Cullasaja, who is a student at Berry School, Ga., has won first prize in the declamation contest among 12 contestants. He spoke on the subject, "The Frontiers of America." Claude is another Macon boy who is doing credit to his county. He has made both honor rolls since entering the school and expects to graduate this year and start his college work at Berry school next year.
