### Over Subscribed In Macon County By \$75.00

Macon county citizens have over subscribed the quota of \$200 set for this county by the United Service Organization state headquarters by the amount of \$75, according to a statement by John Archer, U. S. O. county chairman.

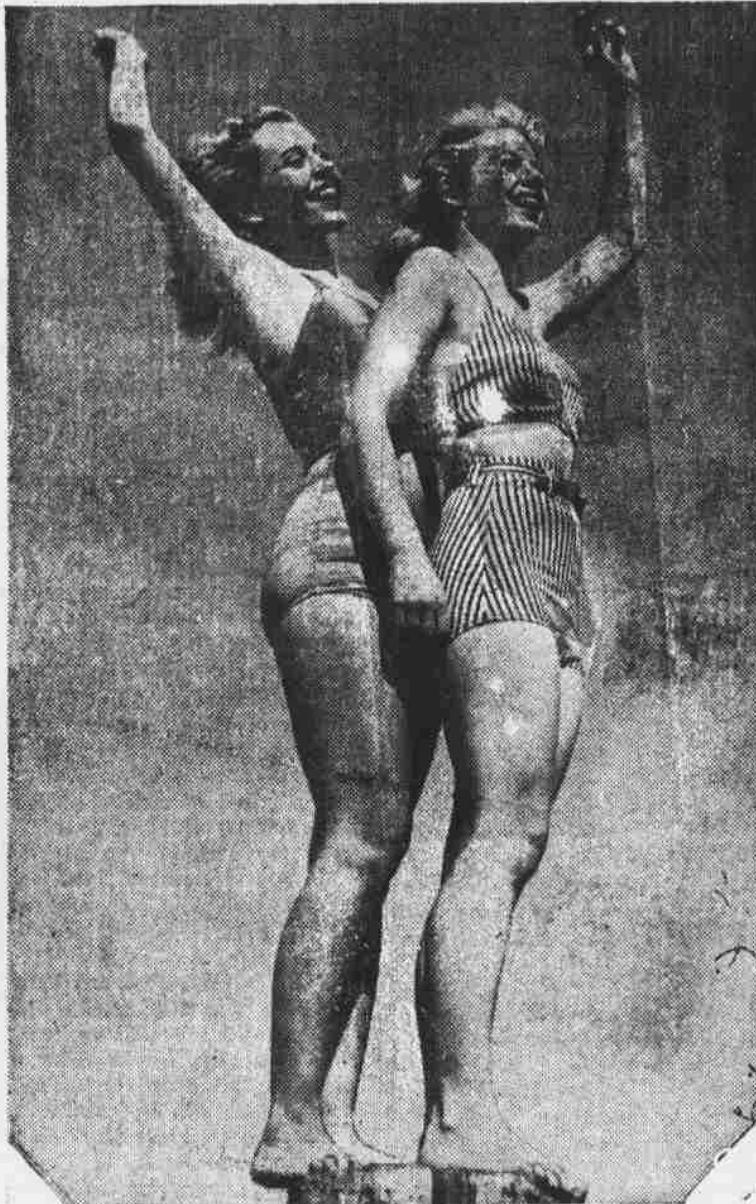

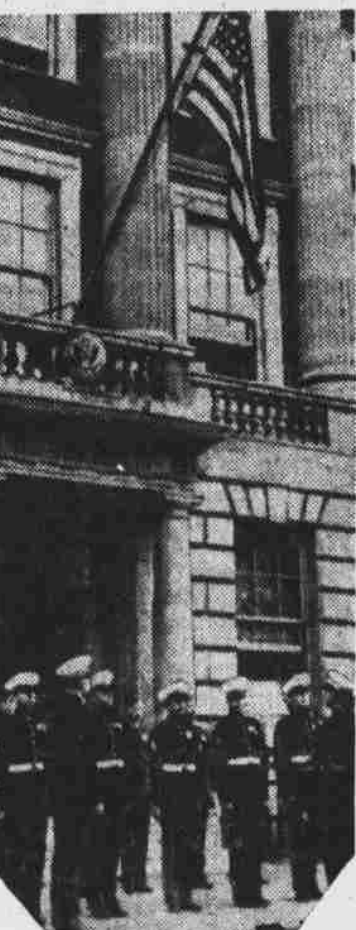

#### AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUE OF SIXTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$60,000.00) GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF BUILDING A COURTHOUSE AND JAIL FOR MACON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA.

Whereas, the present courthouse of Macon County, North Carolina, is now approximately sixty (60) years old; and whereas, the needs of said County have out-grown the present facilities of said courthouse, for that the space in said courthouse, necessary for the protection

of said records of said County, and for the transaction of the public business of said County, are now over crowded and inadequate to meet the needs of said County; and whereas, said building, by reason of age and depreciation, is now in need of repairs; and whereas, the present jail is in all respects inadequate to provide for the needs of said County; and whereas, the Board of County Commissioners has determined it necessary that said County erect and build a new courthouse and jail in order that the public business of said County be carried on, that the records of said County be adequately protected, and adequate jail facilities be provided; and whereas, it has been determined that the cost of the new courthouse for said County will not exceed the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000.00); and whereas, it is proposed to make application to the Works Progress Administration of the United States of America for a project whereby said courthouse will be erected by the said WPA, under the sponsorship of said County Board of Commissioners of Macon County; and whereas, it is estimated that if said project is approved, and that said courthouse is built by the said WPA, that the cost of said building to Macon County, as sponsors thereof, will not exceed the sum of SIXTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$60,000.00).

And whereas, the statement of the debts and assessments of the taxable property of Macon County has this day been presented to the Board of County Commissioners and filed with the Clerk of said board and is open to inspection.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Macon County, North Carolina, at regular meeting assembled on July 7, 1941:

1. That there be issued by the Board of County Commissioners for Macon County, North Carolina not more than SIXTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$60,000.00) General Obligation Bonds of Macon County, bearing interest at the rate of not to exceed four per cent (4%), for the purpose of building and erecting in the Town of Franklin, Macon County, North Carolina a Courthouse and jail, said bonds to be issued at such time as the Board of Commissioners of Macon County may direct by resolution within three (3) years after the date upon which this order shall take effect. The time and place of the payment and other details in connection with said issue of said bonds not inconsistent with this order shall be provided by the Board of County Commissioners by resolution adopted prior to the issuance of said bonds, provided that said bonds shall mature and be made payable, the first not more than three years from the date on which the bonds are issued, and the last of which shall be made payable not more than thirty (30) years from the date of the first issued bonds, and no installments or series shall be more than two and one-half (2½) times of the smallest installments or series.

2. That the maximum aggregate principal of said bonds, as hereinbefore stated, shall be SIXTY

THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$60,000.00).

3. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest shall be annually levied and collected on the taxable property of Macon County.

4. That a statement of the debts of said County has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners thereof at his office and is open for public inspection.

5. That this order shall take effect when approved by the regularly qualified voters at an election held in the manner prescribed by law.

6. That this Order shall be published once in each two successive weeks, after its final passage, in the Franklin Press, a weekly newspaper published in the Town of Franklin, Macon County, North Carolina, and notice shall be published with said Order in the manner prescribed in Section 1334 of the Consolidated Statutes.

#### NOTICE

The foregoing order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under the County Finance Act showing the assessed valuation of Macon County to be \$5,778,744 and the net debt of Macon County for other than school purposes to be \$750,931.96. A tax will be levied on the taxable property of Macon County for the payment of the proposed bonds and interest if the same shall be issued.
