

**National Forests Deer, Bear and Boar Hunting**

Wild boar hunting on Santeetlah Wildlife Management Area begins October 15 and continues for two-day periods through December 29 as follows: October 15-16, 18-19, 22-23, 25-26, 29-30 and December 20-21, 26-27, 28-29. Twelve bear and boar hunts are scheduled for Santeetlah as follows: November 1-2, 5-6, 8-9, 12-13, 15-16, 19-20, 22-23, 26-27, 29-30, and December 3-4, 6-7, 10-11.

For the Pisgah Big Game Hunt (Bear and male Deer) the season opens November 12 and runs through November 24 with hunting everyday except Sunday. The hunts consist of the Main Hunt, Pisgah Ledge Hunt and wilderness Hunts. For further information concerning application and arrangements on boar and bear hunting and the Pisgah Big Game Hunt communicate with the office of J. H. Longshore, N. C. Division of Game and Inland Fisheries, Asheville, N. C.

Hunting of male deer will be permitted at the Mt. Mitchell Wildlife Management Area on November 1, 2, 3, 5, 6 and 7 and on the Daniel Boone Wildlife Area November 12, 13, 14, 15, 16 and 17. Application and arrangements for these hunts should be made through the office of C. N. Mease, Division of Game and Inland Fisheries, Marion, N. C.

**Enlist Now To Retain Old Rank**

Captain Marvin A. Turner, Recruiting and Induction Officer for the State, announced recently that former non-commissioned officers who would like to return to the Army with their old rank could do so if they were honorably discharged since May 12, 1945, and if they re-enlisted by October 25. The men who desire to take advantage of this opportunity

must be physically examined, processed and actually in the Army by October 25. Because of the distance from processing centers, this means that men should apply by October 21 to 23.

Headquarters District Number Two today sought to bring the change in policy to the attention of all former non-commissioned officers. The obvious advantage is that any man re-enlisting after the deadline must do so as a private. If he held a rating such as master sergeant, buck sergeant or corporal and is eligible for reinstatement, he should apply before October 25.

Full information about this re-enlistment inducement may be obtained at any Army Recruiting Station. In Asheville, the Recruiting Station is located in Room 8, Post Office Building, Major Girard Haven is the Commanding Officer.
