During World War I, Admiral McCulley commanded naval forces in France and Russia. He was attached to Russia forces during the Russo-Japanese War.

His awards included the Distinguished Service Medal, the French Legion of Honor, and the Russian Orders of St. Anne, St. Stanislaus and St. Vladimir.

Following his retirement in 1931, he adopted several Russian children, who, with his widow, Mrs. Anna Mari McCulley, survive.
