The Rt. Rev. M. George Henry, bishop of the Episcopal diocese of Western North Carolina, performed the double ring ceremony, with the Rev. A. Rufus Morgan, priest in charge, assisting.

The church was decorated with rhododendron maximum and tall baskets of royal and winged woods fern, interspersed with azure skies and mountain cloud iris, with arrangements of the white iris on the altar. Candelabra with cathedral candles were used, and in each of the stained glass windows was a fan-shaped fern arrangement, centered with a lighted candle. Pewes were marked with greenery and white satin ribbon.

Mrs. A. C. Holt, organist, presented a program of wedding music, and Mrs. Sydney King Russell, soloist, of New York City and Palm Beach, sang "Because," "Oh, Promise Me," and "Fulfillment," the latter an original composition by Mr. Russell, who accompanied her at the organ.

The bride, who entered on the arm of her father, wore a wedding gown of Duchess satin and imported Chantilly lace made with portrait neckline. The tight-fitting bodice was fashioned of lace and featured a wide pointed lace berth. The full skirt was of satin with a motif of lace from just below the waistline ending in a cathedral train. Her full-length gloves were of matching lace, and her two-tiered veil was of imported illusion attached to a lace coronet, trimmed with seed pearls and satin. She wore a tiny gold cross, the gift of her grandfather, and carried a white prayer book, the gift of the groom's mother, from which she showered a bouquet of white orchids and valley lilies.
