Miss Mary Cornwell, Haywood home agent, who accompanied the group to Texas, says the purposes of the exchange are to enable a select group of 4-H boys and girls to study firsthand the agriculture of another area; to obtain a better understanding of basic agricultural



conditions and community and family living; to provide opportunity for boys and girls of the two regions to become better acquainted; and to broaden the group's knowledge of the Southern states.
