divided by 1,507,858 (population of all eligible and qualified municipalities) to determine the amount each municipality would receive for population. The other half was divided by 5,222.44 miles (total length of all streets) to compute mileage amounts.

Of Franklin's total allocation, \$2,975 is for population and \$6,189 for mileage increment.

Highlands will receive \$776 for population and \$3,532 for mileage.

The report said payment will be made by check to the municipalities prior to October 1, 1951.

The amount Franklin will receive is about \$2,000 more than the town's budget estimate. The budget committee estimated that the town would receive approximately \$7,000.

Mr. Chapman delivered the doctrinal sermon at Thursday's session and Friday the Rev. W. L. Sorrells preached a missionary sermon.

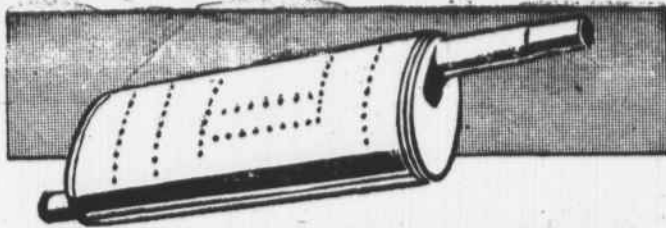
