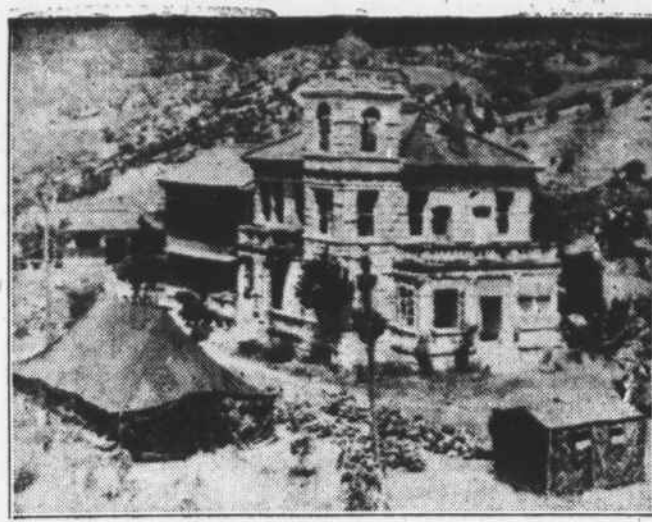

Cpl. Keener Serving in Germany With Air Force

Cpl. Charles R. Keener is serving with the U. S. Air Force in Germany as radio operator, it has been learned.

The 21-year-old soldier is the son of Mrs. G. D. Hedden, Jr., of Bonny Crest, and the late Randolph Keener, of Gneiss.

Cpl. Keener, who received his diploma from Franklin High while in service, enlisted in the air force at the age of 17 and has served at various stations throughout the United States and also spent a 14-month tour of duty in Japan.

He reenlisted in September, 1949, and attended radio school at Scott Air Force base, Ill., graduating in December, 1950.

The young soldier spent a 21-day furlough here with his mother in April before being sent overseas.
