ASK RED CROSS FUND WORKERS FOR REPORTS

County Is About \$1,000 Short Of Goal, But Total Is Not In

County Red Cross workers were requested this week to turn in campaign funds at the local Red Cross office in the Bank of Franklin building not later than Saturday noon.

The annual fund-raising campaign closed Monday with the county about \$1,000 short of its \$3,021 goal. However, more than 35 of the 75 workers still have not reported contributions, according to drive officials.

Funds raised through Tuesday totaled approximately \$2,000. Macon's original goal, \$2,826, was boosted by \$195 last week, following a series of tornadoes that turned sections of six southern states into disaster areas.
