**HIGHLANDS BUDGET EARMARKS
FUNDS FOR NEW FIRE TRUCK**

The \$97,877 1952-53 budget recently adopted by the Highlands board of aldermen earmarks \$6,000 for a new fire truck and another \$6,000 to finish paying for the old school property the town purchased from the county.

An increase of \$15,000 is noted in the new budget over last year. The town's tax rate was set at \$2.50 per hundred valuation, the same as last year.

Anticipated revenue in the budget includes: taxes (all purposes) \$16,576; general fund, \$7,000; cash balance on hand, \$8,652; lights, \$52,344; and water, \$12,500.

Major expenditures listed are: administrative, \$18,922 (figure

includes \$6,000 for purchasing the school property); police and fire department, \$10,369 (amount includes \$6,000 for new fire truck); streets, \$13,674; electricity, \$33,644; and water, \$16,064.

Present fire fighting in Highlands includes two hand-drawn fire carts and a few hundred feet of hose.

The town purchased the old Highlands school property and buildings from the county last year for \$10,000. A joint town and chamber of commerce venture is turning the property into a community recreation center. The town office is now located in the old school building, which has been completely renovated.

**Holly Springs School House
Becoming Dignified Building**
