**TEEN-AGERS SHOWING INTEREST IN 'ROAD-E-O' HERE MAY 12**

Local teen-agers are showing a great deal of interest in the scheduled "Teen-Age Road-e-o" on May 12, according to John Cogan, project co-chairman. The road-e-o, which is being sponsored by the Franklin Jaycees, is designed to test the general knowledge and driving skill of teen-agers. Both written and driving tests will be given, the chairman said. The winner of the local event will be sent to Charlotte June 12 to compete in the state contest, he disclosed. Any teen-ager who has not reached 20 is eligible to enter. Each contestant must have a driver's license or learner's permit. Judges will be local law enforcement and safety officials. Mr. Cogan said an efficiency obstacle course will be set up on Mill Street to test the driv-

ing skill of each contestant. This event will be preceded by written tests at Franklin High school. Teen-agers may register with Edwin T. Williams at the high school or with Vic Perry at Perry's Drug Store, he said.

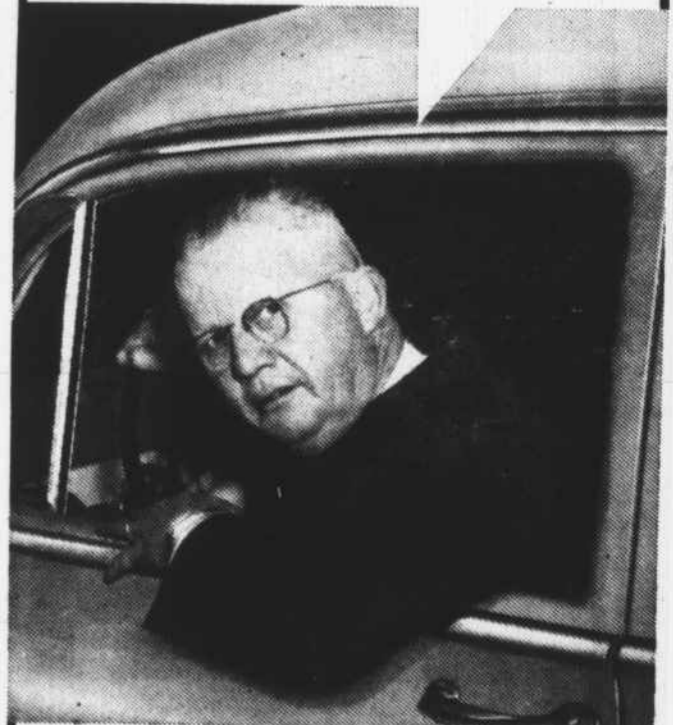
