A. S. C. Committee Reports Funds Left For Fall Jobs

The Macon County A. S. C. committee has announced that some money still is left in the county pool for fall practices.

Practice 14, the committee feels, is one of the best a farmer can carry out on his farm at this time of year. Therefore, it has instructed the county office to issue winter cover crops to any farmer, although he took his quota of conservation in the spring of '55.

Farmers who received assistance in the spring will be helped again this fall in half the amount they were due in the spring, according to Miss Mildred Corbin, acting office manager. This will apply as long as funds hold out, she said, and will be first-come-first-serve.

When all the funds are exhausted, the committee will open the 1956 program.

Following are A. C. P. fall practices:

Practice 1 — permanent pasture; lime, fertilizer, and seed.
Practice 2 — seeding permanent pasture or hay in crop rotation, lime, seed, and fertilizer.

Practice 3 — lime for cropland which will be devoted to perennial grasses in '55 and '56.

Practice 6 — permanent pasture or hay improvement; lime, seed, and fertilizer, or fertilizer and lime.

Practice 7 — ditch drainage or farm ponds for irrigation.

Practice 14 — cover crops — no fertilizer or lime furnished, just seed barley, oats, rye, crimson clover, hairy vetch or annual ryegrass.

The purpose of this practice is to establish winter crop cover on the land to protect it against erosion. Pasturing consists with good management will be permitted, but none of the growth may be harvested for hay or seed. The growth must remain on the land until March 1, 1956, before turning under.
