Couple Rode Less Than Mile; Atlanta Man Dies Instantly
Miss Gladys McDeshen and George E. Mason, both of Franklin, Route 4, are in a Bryson City hospital recovering from injuries received in an automobile wreck Sunday near Bryson City.
An Atlanta, Ga., man was killed instantly when the automobile left the highway, traveled some 300 feet in the air, and landed in a creek, it is reported.
Miss McDeshen and Mr. Mason were picked up by the Atlanta man after their car broke down near Topton. They had ridden less than a mile when the accident happened.
Miss McDeshen received a broken neck and arm, and severe cuts, while Mr. Mason suffered severe internal injuries.
