Be sure to include in your three meals every day: Five servings of fruits and vegetables. One of these vegetables should be yellow, one should be grean, leafy, and one should be rich in vitamin C, as tomatoes, raw cabbage, green peppers, or cantaloupe. One fruit should be uncooked, as the citrus fruits. One fruit may be cooked or the versatile tomato which serves as a fruit or vegetable, the "poor man's orange"; one pint to one quart of milk.

Two servings of protein food, which includes meat, fish, poul-try, eggs, cheese or dried beans or peas. Peas and beans are incomplete protein and can be used once or twice a week as meat substitutes; enriched or whole grain breads or cereals; butter or margarine.
