- 2 Cups red salmon, flaked
- 1/2 Cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 Cup celery, finely chopped
- 2 Tb. lemon juice
- 2 Tsp. gelatin
- 2 Tb. cold water

Combine salmon, salad dressing, celery and lemon juice. Soak gelatin in cold water for five minutes, then dissolve over hot water. Add to salmon mixture. Cool. Pour over cheese layer. To serve, unmold on large platter and garnish with parsley and tomato wedges.
