At the Scout court of honor at Sylva September 9, Jack Wilson and Don Hopper were promoted to first class. Jack also received a Woodcarving merit badge.

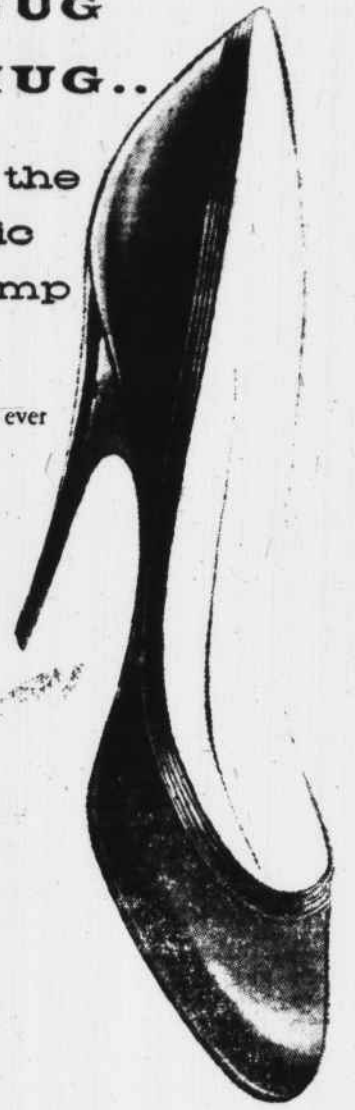

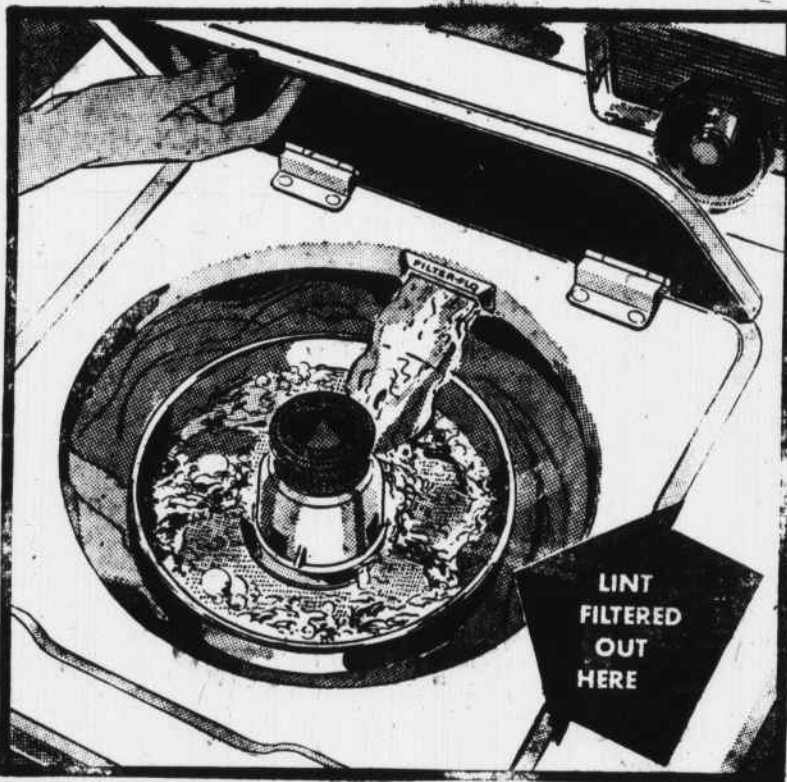
