Accidentally Discharged .22 Rifle Kills Grant

James M. Grant, a native of this county, died from an accidental gunshot wound February 10 at his farm home near Ellijay, Ga. It has been learned here.

It is understood Mr. Grant, 42, tripped on a wire at his hog lot, and, in falling, caused the discharge of a .22 rifle he was carrying. The bullet entered his head, causing instant death, it is said. There were no eyewitnesses to the accident.

Born and reared near Flats, he had been living in Gilmer County, Ga., for nearly 16 years. He was a member of the Briartown Baptist Church.

Funeral services were conducted the 12th at 2 p. m. at the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church, near Ellijay, by the Rev. J. R. Cain. Burial was in the church cemetery.

O. E. S. Fetes State Official On Visit Here

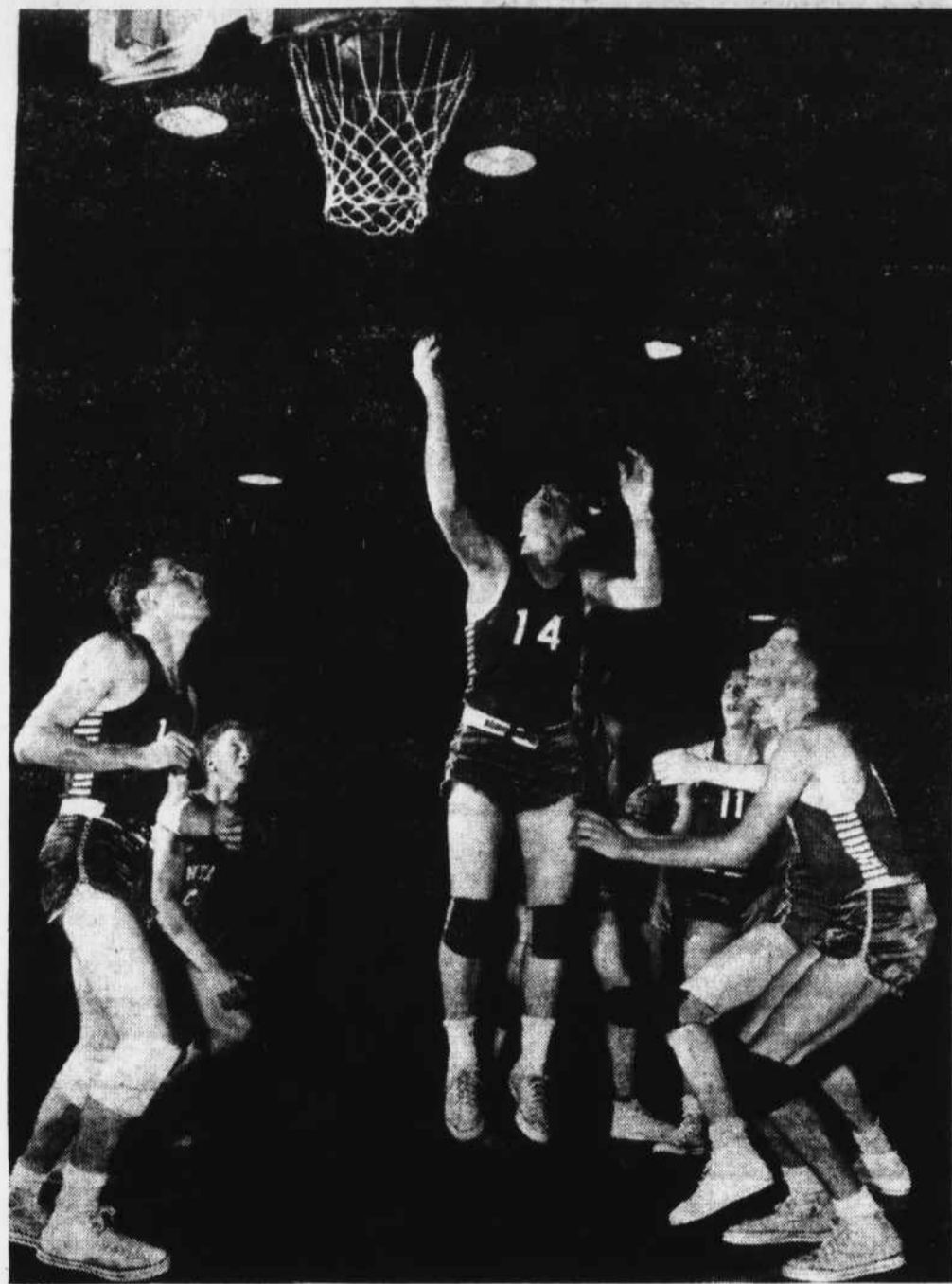

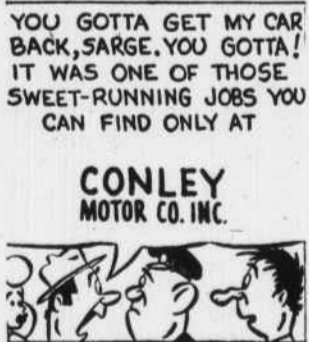
