- It recommends that the following steps be taken for a good seed bed:
1. Test the soil.
 2. Spread lime uniformly.
 3. Disk thoroughly.
 4. Smooth the seed bed.
 5. Fertilize before seeding.
 6. Firm with cultipacker.
 7. Seed uniformly, cover lightly.
