BUTTERSCOTCH PIE

ŧ.	1	pint milk	
ł	1	cup medium brown s	ugar
ł	2	heaping tablespoons	cornstarc
t	2	heaping tablespoons	flour
I	2	egg yolks	
1	12	tsp. salt	
1	3	tb. butter	
ł	1.4	tsp. vanilla	
I			

Method: In the double boiler heat the milk. In a bowl mix well the sugar, cornstarch, and flour. Add hot milk to the sugar mixture. stirring as it is added. Pour the mixture into double boiler. Stir and cook until mixture thickens. Cover and let cook about 15 minutes longer. Beat the eggs and add the salt. Stir this quickly into the milk mixture. Add butter, stir and cook until the egg' thickens. Remove from heat and add vanilla. Pour into a baked crust. Cover with the following meringue

2 egg whites 2 tb. medium brown sugar tsp. salt

12 tsp. vanilla
