COCONUT — MALLO DROPS
(a no-bake cookie)
½ pound marshmallows
1½ cup pitted dates (or any desired fruit)
2 cups chopped nuts
2½ cups shredded coconut
Cut large size marshmallows into quarters or use miniature variety. Melt in a pan over hot water. Add the chopped dates and nuts, then drop by spoonfuls into the shredded coconut. Coat well. Chill on waxed paper; or, drop the mallow mixture on all the coconut. Form into a long roll. Slice for cookies.

Premeasurement Of Burley Is Offered

Official premeasurement of burley tobacco allotments is being offered Macon County farmers for 1957 in line with a state-wide policy.

The premeasured acreage will be accepted as correct for all purposes unless it is later determined that: (1) the crop has not been planted within the premeasured area; (2) less than the premeasured area has been planted; or; (3) there was an obvious error in the premeasurement.

Farmers must pay \$5 for one field and \$6 for two fields for premeasurement. Miss Mildred Corbin, Agriculture Stabilization and Conservation office manager, made the announcement.

New Cleaning Place Opens In Franklin

Truck Accident Claims Life Of Stephen Patton

Son Of Franklin Woman; Services In Pennsylvania

A two-truck collision near Bedford, Pa., Wednesday of last week (Feb. 6) claimed the life of Stephen C. Patton, son of Mrs. Rebecca S. Patton, of Franklin.
Mrs. Patton, who returned here to live several months ago after retiring from government service in Washington, D. C., went by train to Pennsylvania early Thursday morning. Friends here say she plans to remain there with her son's family for the time being.

A relief driver for a trucking company, Mr. Patton, 25, is understood to have been napping in the cab of the truck when it and another large trailer truck smashed head-on on an icy stretch of highway. He was critically injured and died a few hours later in a hospital. The driver of the truck in which he was riding is understood to have been seriously injured.

It has been reported that several hours after the collision of the two trucks, another mishap involving two trucks and an automobile occurred at almost the same location.

Funeral services for Mr. Patton were held Friday afternoon at Honeybrook, Pa.

In addition to his mother, he is survived by his wife, the former Miss Marie Louise Young, of Philadelphia, a three-year-old son, Doug H., and a year-old daughter, Nancy.
