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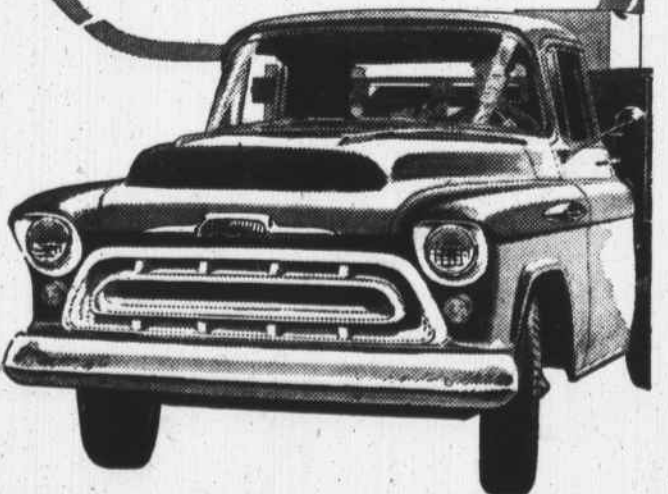

**ON MACON BYWAYS**

Don't you believe the rumor that the wife of a local groceryman is going to appear on a TV giveaway show. It's just that: rumor.

**SPEAKING OF** Raleigh, I notice that the Governor's weighty program hasn't ruled out the legislators taking time for some absurd proposals. Absurd is the word I have for the idea of Rep. Davis P. Dellinger, of Gaston County, who would give a one million dollar reward to the person or business that first finds oil under North Carolina in commercial quantities, i.e., at least 250 barrels of oil per day.

Just like that rotten natural gas bill vetoed by Ike last year, this bill's parenthood can be traced back to the Texas oil interests. Why should we pay somebody a

million dollars to find something they would get rich on anyway?

**THINK THAT** one-way streets would make a good political issue? A Franklin woman does. Says she's seriously considering running for mayor this spring. The town's revised traffic plan would be her main campaign topic.

**JOHN W. ROANE** was telling me about the old days of Macon County. One of the things he recalled was how they drove turkeys to market when he was a boy.

He would go on the wagon with his father from Upper Cartoogechaye. The trip to Turnersville, Ga., was 40 miles and consumed several days. Mr. Roane said there was nothing ever like a white horse for taking turkeys to market. "Turkeys will follow a white horse. If a man didn't own one, he'd rent one. I don't know why, but they like a white horse."

The interesting stories told by Mr. Roane can be matched by all of the citizens of the county who remember the days before the radio, automobile, and income tax. When these folks are gone, much of our county's history passes, too.

Wouldn't it be a good idea if some community club got its senior citizens to put on paper the way of life of bygone days? Someday, historians will search vainly for much of the fact and story which is now available for the asking.

**MACON COUNTY'S** Judge Patton got a mention in The Charlotte News the other day. Commenting on the inaugural ceremonies at Raleigh, reporter Julian Scheer noted that "the capable Attorney-General, who once served Mecklenburg Superior Court, got a nice applause after he was sworn in."

**A READER** in Clinton, N. C., Mrs. J. Boney, writes:

"As you know, there is a special program of Social Security for farmers who will become 65 years of age this year. They can file for 1955 and 1956, if their income was up to a certain amount, and then they are eligible for Social Security benefits."

"In Pitt County the county commissioners have hired a man to go out in the byways and hedges and find these people and help them to get their records filed. They feel that the benefits that can be paid in Pitt to farmers who become 65 this year will amount to a million dollars."

**CHERRY TREE COFFEE CAKE**

2 packages or cakes of yeast  
1/4 cup lukewarm water  
1 cup milk  
1/4 cup butter  
1/2 cup sugar  
1 teaspoon salt  
2 eggs - beaten  
5 cups flour (about)  
1/2 cup red-hot cinnamon candies  
1 small jar maraschino cherries (with juice)  
1 cup powdered sugar

Dissolve yeast in the 1/4 cup lukewarm water. Scald milk. Add butter, sugar, and salt to the hot milk. Cool to lukewarm. Add yeast and eggs. Add about half the flour (or enough to make a drop batter). Beat until the mixture is smooth and bubbles appear on the surface. Add more flour to form soft dough. Add 1/2 cup, cinnamon red-hot candies. Turn out on lightly floured board and knead until satiny. Place in greased bowl, cover, and let rise until double in bulk (about 2 hours). When light, punch down, shape into balls, and place balls in the shape of tree. Put maraschino cherries between balls, and spread with melted butter. Allow to rise until double in bulk (1/2 to 3/4 hour). Bake in moderate oven (375 degrees F.) 25 to 30 minutes. Mix powdered sugar and cherry juice and spread on top.

**Warning Issued About Fake Cancer Cure**

The U. S. Government, through a poster put up in the Franklin post office last week, is warning citizens against the so-called Hoxsey cancer treatment.

The cure has been found "worthless by two Federal courts," the poster says.

Under the heading "Public Beware!" the poster says the cure costs \$400 plus \$60 additional fees. "It yields nothing of value in the cure of cancer," says the Food and Drug Administration, which prepared the poster.

"It consists essentially of simple drugs which are worthless for treating cancer. . . . The only cure for cancer is by surgery or radiation. . . . Death is inevitable when cancer patients fail to obtain proper medical treatment because of the lure of a painless cure 'without the use of surgery, X-ray, or radiation' as claimed by Hoxsey."

"Not a single verified cure of internal cancer by this treatment has been found."

According to a United Press story from Washington, the poster is the first of its kind ever issued by the Food and Drug Administration.
