Hosiery Plants Observe Vacations This Month

Franklin's two hosiery plants, Franklin Hosiery Company and the Van Raalte Company, observed vacation periods this month with Van Raalte closed an extra two weeks because of over production.

Franklin Hosiery, a plant of Burlington Industries, took the week of July 4, although some departments worked part of the week "to meet the schedule of goods shipments," according to Supt. Stephen A. Bundy. Looping and mending worked part-time (Monday through Wednesday) with the knitting and inspection departments closed the entire week.

Vacation pay comes to Burlington employees in the form of a bonus. Those with one year or more receive two per cent of their annual gross earnings and those with five or more years get four per cent of their earnings. The bonus was paid during vacation week.

Franklin Hosiery Company now has 370 people working for it. Van Raalte, with 90 to 100 employees, will resume operations Monday after being closed since June 28. The employees were laid off for two weeks and paid for the other week. They receive a second week of paid vacation at Christmas.

Norman Blaine, Van Raalte's superintendent here, said over production necessitated the extra two-week shutdown.
