Costs Compared For Filter Plants

At the Franklin Board of Aldermen's request, the Harwood-Beebe engineering firm has supplied figures for the cost of a filter plant at various capacities less than the one the company suggested for Franklin.

Regardless of the size plant, there would be fixed costs (roughly) of \$22,000 for an intake system, 1^{1/2} cents a thousand gallons for chemicals, a main from the pumping station to the filter plant, \$3,400, and a connection from the filter plant to the town's mains. \$10,000. To these figures would be add-

ed the basic cost, at various capacaties, as follows: 1/4 million gallons daily, \$75,000.

12 million gallons daily 125,000. 1 million gallons daily, 245,000.


