

Franklin Mail Is Stolen At Dillard Break-In

Franklin residents have been getting personal mail delivery by the Dillard, Ga., postmaster for the last week because of a postal robbery there the night of July 19. A stack of letters was taken from the post office and rifled as the robbers apparently searched for money. Part of the letters were later recovered in woods near Dillard. No arrests have been made in connection with the theft. Postmaster C. E. Dillard said he was making the delivery of the recovered letters personally to save the time of writing individual letters of explanation. The robbers seem to have gotten hold of a Highlands-to-Franklin packet of mail.

Costs Compared For Filter Plants

At the Franklin Board of Aldermen's request, the Harwood-Beebe engineering firm has supplied figures for the cost of a filter plant at various capacities less than the one the company suggested for Franklin.

Regardless of the size plant, there would be fixed costs (roughly) of \$22,000 for an intake system, 1 1/2 cents a thousand gallons for chemicals, a main from the pumping station to the filter plant, \$3,400, and a connection from the filter plant to the town's mains, \$10,000.

To these figures would be added the basic cost, at various capacities, as follows:
1/4 million gallons daily, \$75,000.
1/2 million gallons daily, 125,000.
1 million gallons daily, 245,000.

C.A.P. Practices Search Mission

Franklin C.A.P. Takes Part In Mt. Mitchell Plane Crash Search

Seven adult members and six cadets of the Franklin Civil Air Patrol took part in the search and rescue mission Thursday morning of last week for a private plane that crashed in the Mt. Mitchell area. The plane was found in mid-morning by a Marion C.A.P. member. Pilots from Franklin never actually saw the wreckage because visibility on the south side of the mountain was too poor to permit flying in the area. The aircraft hit Mt. Mitchell, at about 4,500 feet up its 6,684-foot elevation.

However, the cadets were part of the ground rescue mission which went into the woods and brought out the plane's occupants, three members of a Cleveland, Ohio, family, none of whom suffered serious injuries.
