EVENT SET 12TH - It's Farmers Federation Picnic Time Once Again

The federation's annual Macon County picnic will be held Saturday, July 12, at Franklin High School beginning at 10 a.m. It has been announced by James McClure Clarke, president of the 38-year-old farm cooperative.

Once again an outstanding entertainment program has been scheduled including the Blue River Boys, of Statesville, "Pan-handle Pete" Nash and the Farmers Federation string band, led by Steve Ledford and Johnny Rymer, along with Linda and Patsy Neal, of Franklin, talented acrobats, Gaither Robinson, well-known banjo player, and many others.

Mr. Clarke has urged all local musicians, singers, choirs, quartets, and other entertainers to attend the picnic and compete for prizes.

A \$10 prize will be awarded for the best local act and other prizes will be given to winning quartets and choirs.

The Rev. Jack Waldrep, religious director of the Farmers Federation, will give a report on the Lord's Acre work in Western North Carolina. Short talks on farming, federation activities, and other subjects will be given by extension personnel, federation department heads, and others.

Gene Frizzell, Franklin store manager, promises plenty of watermelon and lemonade for all attending the picnic.

Sack races, relay races, tug-of-war, and various other events will be held during the noon hour.

Lunch will be available on the grounds, although all are urged to bring their own picnic baskets.

Carnegie Gives College Library \$900 Grant

A grant of \$900 has been awarded to Hunter Library at Western Carolina College by the Carnegie Corporation of New York for use in the purchase of color slides depicting American arts. It has been announced by Mrs. Lillian Buchanan, librarian.

Mrs. Buchanan said the collection of 1,500 slides will be available next fall, and the filing and projection equipment are already on hand.

The Carnegie gifts came as the culmination of a two-year survey of the visual arts of the United States, covering 18 categories ranging from painting to architecture silver to furniture. A special feature is a collection of varied arts of the Indians from New Mexico to Alaska. A main purpose of the project was to provide suitable materials for teaching courses not only in art, but also in those dealing with American social and cultural history.

Institutions receiving the sets are expected to keep detailed records of the use of the experimental sets.

Mrs. Buchanan explained that the set of slides will be accompanied by a complete catalog containing pertinent data on each slide and essays by an outstanding authority covering each of the categories of the study.

It is expected that this gift will be of much value in the teaching program at Western Carolina. Every freshman is required to take a course in art history and appreciation, and will have opportunity for further study of the slides as they advance into other courses.

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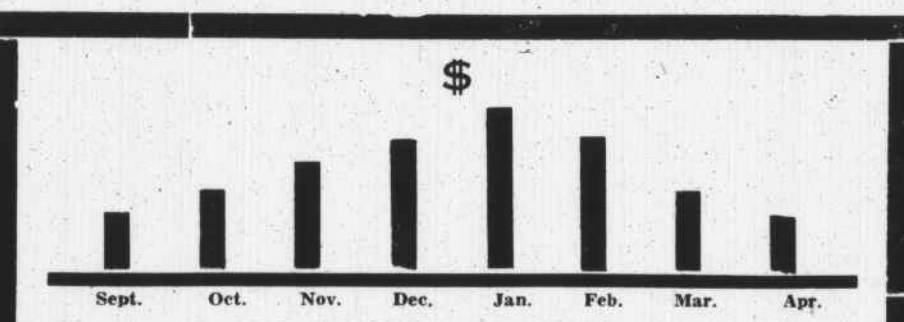
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
