30 MINUTE ROLLS

Sift together 2½ cups flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, ¼ teaspoon salt. Into 1 cup lukewarm buttermilk dissolve 3 tablespoons butter, 1 yeast cake, ¼ teaspoon soda, 1 tablespoon sugar. Mix well with other ingredients. Make into dough. Knead until very smooth. Roll out and make into pocket book rolls. Dip each roll into melted butter or lard. Fold over and let rise in a warm place 30 minutes or until double in size. Bake in a moderate oven until golden brown.

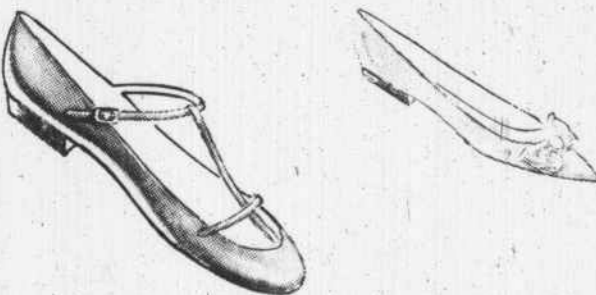
