



Garden Time . . .

While the dahlia is not grown as extensively as some of our other flowers, it is highly prized by all who do grow it. Here are some tips for the remainder of the growing season:

Each plant should be side-dressed with a good handful of a complete fertilizer, such as an 8-8-8, about every three weeks until September 1 in the lower mountains and until September 15 east of the mountains.

Buds will usually occur in clusters of three. On the large flowering varieties, the two outer buds should be pinched off and the center bud saved. If a long stem is desired the side branches, or suckers, should be removed from the next two (lower) nodes, or leaf axils, of the stem. On small flowering varieties the flower buds are not removed but left to develop normally. It is especially important that early disbudding be practiced if you plan to exhibit

at a community fair or garden club show this fall.

Spraying for insects pests must not be neglected if you want perfect flowers and foliage. Leaf hoppers, red spiders and some of the plant bugs are especially troublesome and you must keep constantly on the lookout. The corn earworm is a late offender on large buds as they are ready to open. Keep malathion handy and spray your plants thoroughly. Follow in-

Georgia Roughest

About 34 miles in Georgia has been the roughest part of the trail he's tackled. With the exception of about four miles between Mount Rabun and Mountain City, he had to hack out a new trail. Things eased up from Salt Rock to Cowee, via Scaly and Shortoff, and he was able to follow existing trails for all but about two miles.

Morgan's Help

Mr. Cole, who is staying at Miss Olive Patton's in Franklin, said he has received valuable assistance from the Rev. A. Rufus Morgan, Macon County's widely-known Episcopal minister, who was instrumental in the opening of the Appalachian Trail through this section.

Together, they plan to scout the region from Cowee Gap to Beech Gap.

Once the entire alternate has been mapped and marked, it will be up to the Appalachian Trail Conference to adopt it officially.

He has one observation to make about the whole idea: "I have been over five Rattlesnake Mountains and I haven't found a rattler yet."

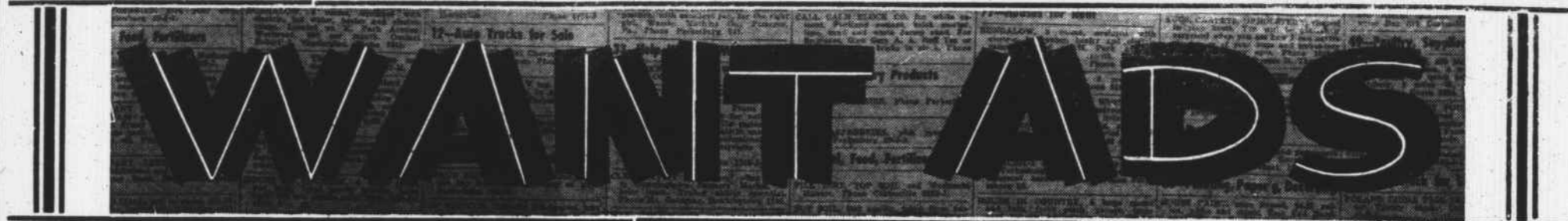

Chocolate Changes Pudding Into Glamour Dessert



When you get to those last few slices in a loaf of bread, don't throw them away just because they're not really fresh. Dress them up with semi-sweet chocolate, in this old-fashioned dessert gone festive.

Easy to use, the little chocolate morsels that come in a 6-ounce package or in the new jumbo 12 oz. bag, are melted to flavor the bread pudding itself, and used whole in the meringue topping the dish. Semi-sweet chocolate morsels are the very same chocolate used to make the original Chocolate Chip Cookies, as invented at the Toll House Inn in Whitman, Mass.

Chocolate Bread Pudding
1 1/4 cups soft bread crumbs
1 6 oz. package (1 cup) semi-sweet chocolate morsels
1/2 cup sugar
2 cups milk
2 eggs, separated
2 tablespoons butter
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Combine bread crumbs, 1/2 cup semi-sweet chocolate morsels, 1/2 cup sugar and 1 1/2 cups milk in top of double boiler. Cook over hot water until mixture is smooth. Beat egg yolks slightly, add remaining 1/2 cup milk, butter and salt. Add to chocolate mixture and continue cooking about 3 minutes longer, stirring constantly. Turn into shallow baking dish. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) 10 minutes. While pudding is baking, beat egg whites until stiff; gradually add remaining 1/2 cup sugar and vanilla; continue beating until very stiff. Fold in half the remaining chocolate. Drop by tablespoons on top of the pudding. Sprinkle meringue with remaining chocolate. Return to oven and bake 10 minutes longer. YIELD: 6 servings.
