79 ENROLLED THIS YEAR — Three Maconians Are Making Outstanding Marks At WCC

Cullowhee—Macon County has a long record of having sent fine

students to Western Carolina College, and many of them have returned to the county to teach in local schools.

This fall there are 79 Maconians enrolled at the college, and among them are three whose scholastic records are so outstanding as to merit special attention.

In addition to scholastic honors, she is treasurer of the Future Teachers of America, member of the student English seminar and the International Relations Club. She is also majoring in English and social science.

She has been listed on both the Beta and Alpha honor rolls, and participates in several student activities. 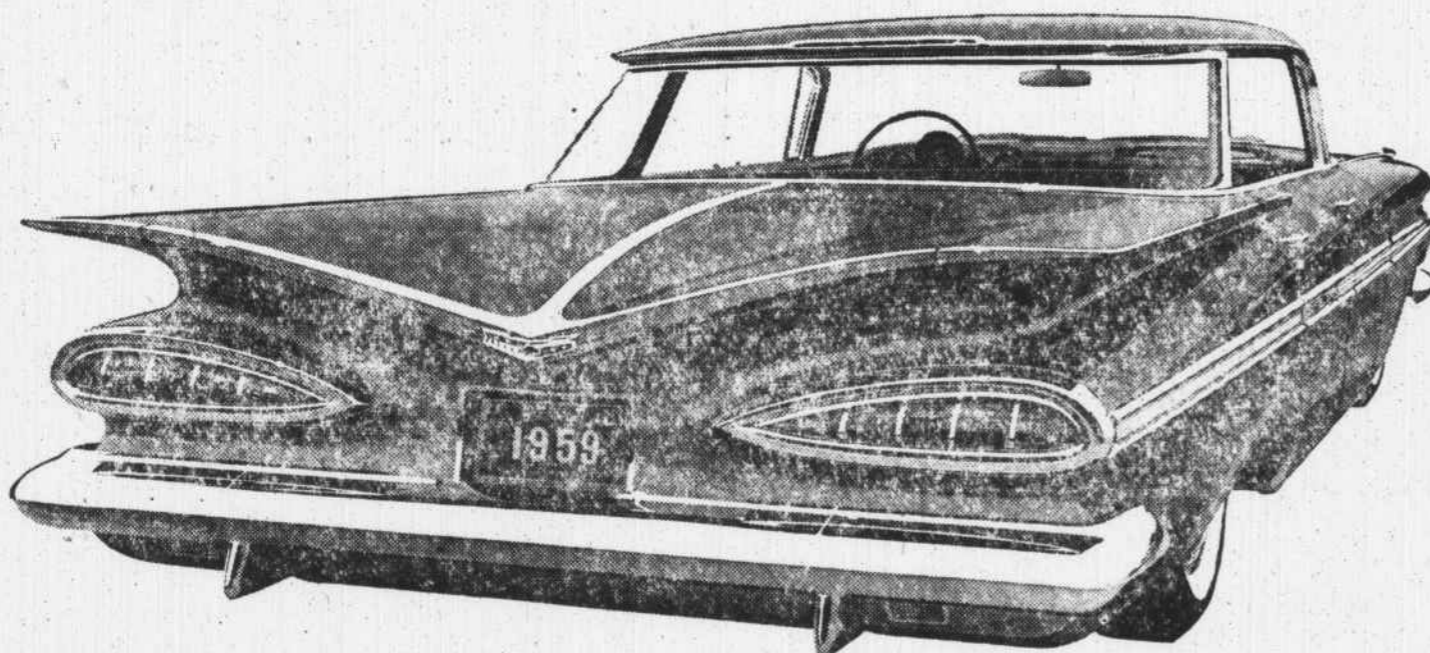
