4 Florida oranges Spiced Orange Wedges

Put whole oranges in saucepan; add 1 quart water. Bring to a boil; boil 20 minutes. Drain and cut into eighths, Combine sugar, 1¼ cups water, vinegar, cloves and cinnamon; stir over low heat until sugar is dissolved. Bring to a boil; add pieces of orange and simmer about 20 minutes. Cool; cover and store in refrigerator. Serve as a relish. NOTE: Orange wedges may be spooned into sterilized jars and sealed.
