LESSON FOR DECEMBER

A LESSON IN TRUST AND PATIENCE

LESSON TEXT—Luke 12:13-40.
GOLDEN TEXT—The life is more than
meat, and the body is more than
raiment.—Luke 12:23.

PRIMARY TOPIC—The Story
of the Rich Man.

JUNIOR TOPIC—A Foolish Rich Man.
INTERMEDIATE AND SENIOR
TOPIC—Rich Toward God.

YOUNG PEOPLE AND ADULTS
TOPIC—True Riches.

Since on October 8 we had
on the birth and childhood of
many will doubtless prefer
this new lesson instead of the
Christmas lesson.

I. A Warning Against Covetousness
(vv. 13-21).

1. The Occasion (vv. 13-15).
The company requested Jesus
to act as umpire in a disputed estate
brothers were in trouble over
inheritance. Christ refused to
act as umpire in the civil law and
against the spirit of avarice.
The parable of the rich man
mission was preeminently spiritual.

2. Enforcement of the Warning
(vv. 16-21). The parable of the
rich man shows clearly that to be
rich with earthly riches while
neglecting God is the height of folly. The
warning is of great importance
for many are seeking gold and
not God.

Note (1) his in-
crease of goods (v. 16). His riches were
obtained, for the ground brought
forth plentifully. This shows that
he may be rich because of the
blessing upon him. (2) His pride
(v. 17). His land was producing
more than his barns would hold. He
wanted it to go to waste. If he
had possessed the right views of life
in a sense of stewardship before
he would have seen that his barns
had not enough for his personal
use that he could have distributed
plus to the needy and for his
own purposes. (3) The fatal error
(vv. 18, 19). He chose to en-
large his barns and give up his life to
luxury. It ought to be a
task for men whom God
has rich to devote their time and
talents to the distribution of their
possessions to benevolent purposes. (4)
The final indictment (vv. 20, 21).
He made himself a fool.

II. The Certain Cure for
Covetousness (vv. 32-34).

Having shown the folly of
the man who gained gold but lost
his soul, Jesus now urged the disciples to
not be anxious and dismiss all anxious
care, assured them that they need not
be anxious even for the necessities of
life.

Note:
1. The Argument (vv. 22, 23).
It is summed up in one brief
sentence: "The life is more than food,
the body is more than raiment,"
who gave the life and made
himself to be trusted to provide
clothing.

2. The Illustrations (vv. 24, 25).
God's care for the fowls of the air.
The ravens do not sow nor
have not storehouse or barn,
yet God feeds them. Do not
forget the fowls, for God
would do more for His children
than for the fowls.
God's care for the flowers
(vv. 27, 28). If God is so
careful for those flowers which appear
for a day, how much more will
He care for His children!
