The most remarkable event of the entire tournament was the shooting done by the juniors under 16. The average scores by these boys were high. Shooting for the juniors was under the auspices of the Junior Ar-

chery Association, a national organization, and four of them, Stephen A. Douglas V, of Greensboro; Robert Hubbard, of High Point; R. D. Douglas, Jr., of Greensboro, and Billie Edgerton, of Greensboro, all received gold medals, for their high scores.

Last year at the mid-winter tournament in Pinehurst, less than a dozen archers participated, four of whom came from the North. The fact that 26 archers from the Carolinas participated in the State championship

tournament is evidence of the rapid growth in popularity of this noble and ancient sport.

Archery clubs are being formed at Sedgefield, Gastonia, Pinehurst and other cities in the State and all archers are invited to communicate with Phillip Rounseville, secretary of the Carolina Archers, at Pinehurst, for full details about joining the State organization.
