To Herman Parker, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Parker of Vass, goes the honor of being the first Vass-Lakeview High School alumnus to become a Phi Beta Kappa man. Herman, who is a senior at the University of North Carolina, was informed by let-ter on October 17 that his academic record was satisfactory for his election to Phi Beta Kappa, national honorary scholastic fraternity.

Herman's friends at home will learn of this with pleasure, but not with surprise, for they have been expecting great things of him. During his four years in high school here his average was around 97. With the exception of one time when he received "B" on first year agriculture, no letter except "A" appeared on his reports in high school. But that "B" didn't mean that Herman was not an A-1 farmer, for during the summers he tends a tobacco crop which goes a long way in defraying his expenses in college during the next year.

Herman is considered one of the best all-round students that has ever attended the Vass school. He was one of the star basketball players.
