

Maid Confesses Thefts From Pinehurst Home

Gets Suspended Sentence After Plea of Guilty.—Other Recorder's Court News

Bella McLaughlin, colored, in Recorder's Court Monday plead guilty of the larceny of household furnishings and linens to the value of \$20 or more from the home of Mrs. George Wallace in Pinehurst, where she had been working. Upon payment of the costs and upon condition of good behavior for twelve months, her four months jail sentence was suspended.

Annie McKeithen, colored, of Vass, was found guilty of possessing and transporting liquor and of using profane and indecent language. She was given a three months jail sentence, to be suspended upon payment of the costs and upon condition of good behavior for two years. The sheriff was asked to destroy the two-thirds pint of liquor.

Clarence Dupree, colored, of Hoke county was found guilty of careless, reckless and drunken driving. His license was revoked for a year and he was given a 30-day road sentence, this to be suspended upon payment of a \$50 fine and the costs.

Daniel H. Gillis, white, of the Eagle Springs section, faced charges of careless and reckless driving as a result of a collision with a colored man's car. He was sentenced to serve 60 days on the roads, this to be suspended upon payment of a \$25 fine, the costs, and damages to the car of the prosecuting witness.

Carl Greene, charged with malicious injury to property, was called and failed to appear.

A case against Carlton Blue was continued and judgment absolute was entered against his bondsman, R. W. Blue.

Stubborn Fire Sunday on Connecticut Ave.

House Jointly Occupied by L. R. King and Marshall Palmer Ablaze in Their Absence

Southern Pines, going safely through the summer months, suffered its first autumn fire shortly after 4:00 o'clock Sunday afternoon when the fire department was called out to fight a stubborn and intensely smoky blaze in the house at No. 10 West Connecticut avenue.

Jointly tenanted by the families of L. R. King and Marshall Palmer, all away from home at the time, the fire apparently originated in bedding and clothing stored in a closet in the Palmer apartment, emitted a dense and pungent smoke which filled the rooms and halls, and made the task of locating the fire smoldering in the partitions and ceiling a trying one for the firemen. The alarm was turned in by Mercer Covington.

The house, years ago the home of William Saunders, an early settler famous for his attractive gardens, is now the property of Mrs. Emily J. Sherwood. House and furniture were insured by the Stevens agency. The greatest loss was suffered by the Palmers who carried no insurance on their personal effects.

REDUCTION IN DEATH RATE FROM TYPHOID, TUBERCULOSIS

The death rate from typhoid fever in North Carolina was reduced from 35.8 per 100,000 in 1914 to 2.1 in 1936, figures compiled by the State Board of Health show.

But there should not be any deaths from this disease, health officials say, because it is practically 100 per cent preventable.

During the period referred to the death rate in this state from tuberculosis, formerly the "captain of killers" was reduced from 139.3 to 60.0. Physicians now know how to treat tuberculosis. They can teach people how to guard against it better than they could in former times.

Cancer, which is neither preventable nor curable, has continued its ravages, unconquered, while syphilis curable but not preventable, from a practical standpoint, is a raging epidemic in North Carolina and throughout the civilized world, except in Norway, Sweden and Denmark. It is controllable and these countries have applied control methods. The results have spoken for themselves.

Typhoid fever has been on the downgrade since the world war. It was during that period that it was learned for a certainty that preventive methods were effective in fact as well as in theory. This was proven without a doubt. In 1924 deaths from typhoid fever in North Carolina numbered 839. The total for 1936 was only 71 for the entire state. In no year since 1933 has the number of deaths from typhoid in North Carolina reached 100.

That Dam Gate

Another Arrest Made in Connection With Disappearance of Lakeview Machinery

A second arrest in the Lakeview dam gate machinery case was made Monday night of this week when officers took into custody a 16-year-old colored boy, Dock Griffin, of near Jonesboro. Harold Mansfield, white, is under bond and Horace Griffin, a relative of Dock, who resides in the Jonesboro community, is wanted by officers.

According to the story officers say that Dock told them, he and Horace Griffin were on their way to the home of Harold Mansfield's father when they came upon the gate hoisting machinery in the woods near Jonesboro. They went to Sanford and got Harold Mansfield to take his truck and haul the machinery to Sanford where they sold it for junk, receiving between three and four dollars for it.

Mansfield denies any part in the transaction except that of hauling the machinery to the junk yard for the boys, for which he claims that he was paid \$1.50 truck hire.

No explanation has been advanced as to how the machinery happened to be in the woods near Jonesboro.
