Twenty-Five Classes For Annual Flower Show in Pinehurst Church

Exhibit Next Week Expected to Surpass Predecessors.—Opens Thursday Afternoon

Plans for the annual flower show at the Pinehurst Community Church are rapidly taking form and from present indications the event will surpass last year's exhibition. The show will open at 2:00 o'clock next Thursday afternoon, November 3, and remain open through Friday evening.

There will be 25 classes open for exhibit and the committee hopes everyone in the community will show either plants or flowers, or both. Ample room has been provided for all exhibits.

Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts and the Pinehurst school children will exhibit garden scenes which will be educational to the public. Music and singing will be featured during the show, and a buffet lunch will be served to add to the enjoyment of the evenings. Admission, to include tea, will be 35 cents.

Those desiring to exhibit plants and flowers should communicate with Mrs. Lewis Kelly, general chairman of the show.

The various classes have been announced as follows:

- 1—Any house pot plant in bloom;
- 2—Any foliage house plant in bloom;
- 3—Any fruit plant such as fig, orange, lemon, cherry, etc.;
- 4—Any cactus or succulent plant in single pot;
- 5—Miniature gardens, either cactus or any other kind;
- 6—Arrangement of dried flowers in suitable containers;
- 7—Arrangement of cut flowers in vase judged for effect and arrangement;
- 8—Arrangement of cut flowers in basket judged for arrangement;
- 9—Ten native shrubs arranged in suitable containers, and properly labeled;
- 10—Ten native tree branches arranged and properly named;
- 11—Arrangement of long leaf pine needles with cones as table centerpieces;
- 12—Display of fruit and flowers for a table centerpiece;
- 13—Christmas and Thanksgiving table decorations;
- 14—Garden scenes;
- 15—Display of fruit and vegetables, for men only;
- 16—Any arrangement for children under 10 years;
- 17—Window decorations;
- 18—Mantel;
- 19—Bridge refreshment tables;
- 20—Table arranged for six or eight;
- 21—shadow box arrangements;
- 22—Tulb plants of any kind;
- 23—Schools exhibits;
- 24—Arrangement of natural berries;
- 25—Pottery arrangement.

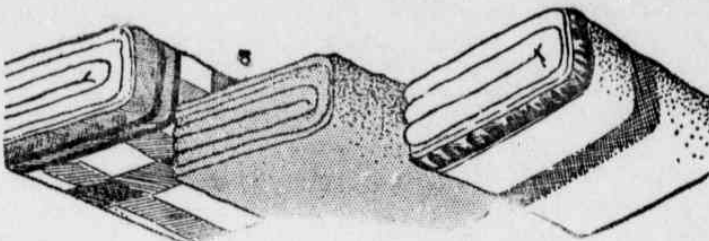
