(Continued from page one) since that of the McBrayer building on February 24th, 1934, and was subdued with but trifling loss compared to what it might have been but for their prompt arrival and efficient work. The oher calls were for grass fires and out of town assistance, among others the tragic Schirmer fire at Manley where the Southern Pines company was not called until the house was destroyed. Their services were continued through the following days searching the ruins for the remains of the unfortunate man.
