SHORT CIRCUIT CAUSES APARTMENT HOUSE FIRE An alarm of fire sounded at 5:30 o'clock Monday evening hurried the apparatus of the Southern Pines Fire Company to the Case apartments, located on Ashe street, where a short circuit in the wiring of an apartment in the rear of the building had filled many of the rooms with a dense and suffocating smoke. The firemen promptly located the seat of the fire in the partitioning of a closet in the kitchen on the first floor, and were able to extinguish the flames with a minimum of damage to the apartments directly affected.
