

Cotton Ordered for 1,000 More Mattresses

New Program To Be Started and Miss McDonald Explains Regulations

A new mattress program will be started this month in Moore county sponsored by the Extension Service...

The new regulations will make it possible for many more families to receive the mattresses. The following regulations will determine the families eligible:

Any family, regardless of its place or residence, is eligible for material provided at least one-half of its total income is derived from agricultural occupations...

Any family, regardless of its source of income, is eligible for material provided it lives in the country and its total income did not exceed \$500 plus \$50 for each member of the family over four persons.

Total or gross income means all cash income plus local market value of farm products held for sale...

One mattress for every two members of the family, up to three mattresses may be had, except that any mattress previously received shall be deductible.

Applications are to be approved by the County committee. All rural families in the county who are certified to be on relief by the local welfare agency may be approved without any further check.

Moore Paid \$88,414 in Sales Taxes in Year Figures for Various Counties of State Announced by Revenue Department Moore contributed \$88,414.73 in sales and use taxes to the North Carolina Revenue department during the 1939-1940 fiscal year. The sales tax is a three percent levy on virtually all retail sales within the state. The use tax is a three percent tax on articles bought outside the state for use in North Carolina.

Mecklenburg led the state with a total paid of \$1,317,911, with Guilford next, \$957,123, and Forsyth third, \$674,541. In this neighborhood, counties contributed as follows: Lee, \$79,210; Hoke, \$16,653; Cumberland, \$204,063; Chatham, \$37,810; Harnett, \$871,181; Montgomery, \$28,988; Richmond, \$110,780 and Scotland, \$51,232.
