

MOORE SCHOOLS TO HAVE SEVEN MORE TEACHERS

County Allotment Boosted to 184; Five Additional Vocational Instructors Added

While some counties in the State are sustaining cuts in number of school teachers being allotted for the coming school year, Moore County will have two additional regular teachers and five new vocational teachers next year.

The State quota of teachers has been raised from 182 to 184, the new teachers being assigned to Westmoore school and the Pinckney Negro High School in Carthage. Of the total number of teachers, 128 are white and 56 Negro.

The additional vocational teachers in agriculture and home economics will be available to high school pupils attending the Aberdeen, Cameron, Carthage, Elise and Vass-Lakeview schools. Westmoore, High Falls and Sandhills Farm Life schools will have home economics departments this year.

Commercial courses are to be offered in Carthage, Cameron, West End, Aberdeen, Sandhill Farm Life and Elise schools, but there will be no county allotment for this work, the courses being on a tuition basis. The Carthage Negro school will have both agriculture and home economics departments.

The allotments for the county do not include the city administration suits of Southern Pines and Pinehurst, which will considerably increase the number of teachers available for Moore County youth during the coming school year.

Moore Schools Ask Increase in Budget

Total of \$35,000 Additional Funds Asked for Current Expense and Capital Outlay

An increase of \$35,000 in the Moore County school budget for the coming year has been asked of the County Commissioners by the County Board of Education.

Of the total increase, \$11,781.38 is asked for current expenses of running the schools, and an additional \$23,218.62 for capital outlay. Total askings are \$55,794.87 for current expense and \$60,000 for capital outlay, including the debt service expenses of about \$79,000, this makes a total budget requested for schools of approximately \$185,794.87.

The current expense item includes estimates for the city administrative units of Pinehurst and Southern Pines, but the capital outlay requests are exclusive of these two units.

Additional teachers for the county schools is responsible for the requested increase in current expense item, it was explained, and the urgent need of more room in several of the schools calls for additional funds for capital outlay.

Romero, as Duke, the manager of a dance hall, has quite a reputation as a local Casanova. But he fails to impress Carole, who is a newcomer to the dance palace. And when this same blonde barges into a crap game, in which Duke is a big winner and then cleans him out, he really loses his ego. From that moment, Duke is out to get even, and how he does it makes for top-flight entertainment.

Refreshingly different and frank, "Accent On Love," the attraction for Friday and Saturday, July 25, 26 with a Saturday matinee, based on a novel by Dalton Trumbo, is realistically treated and provides exceptional entertainment.

George Montgomery, the new 20th Century-Fox coming star, does a grand job with his role as the son-in-law of a large real estate operator.
