Private Herrmann Writes from Missouri, where General Rain and Friend Mud Prevail

Jefferson Barracks, Mo.—Selected Herrmann Grover, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. C. Grover of Southern Pines, just arrived at Jefferson Barracks to be attached to the Air Corps replacement training center and has been tentatively assigned to Flight 23, 357th School Squadron.

"When I arrived here, I was greeted by a downpour of rain, which continued, more or less, for several days, when it turned into snow. Most of us who came from Fort Bragg were quite discouraged at first by the rain and its faithful friend, Mud, but we soon became used to it, as did all the others before us, and now we hardly notice it," Private Grover stated.

"Everyone here is very friendly toward his fellow soldier, which makes it seem as if it were one big family. Our Flight Commander, Lt. G. S. Priebe, seems to be a very able officer and a swell fellow, too," he continued. "We are just 10 miles from St. Louis, which is a soldier's dream city. Hospitality toward us soldiers is wonderful. The local merchants have purchased tickets, which were given to us for the 'Ice Follies for 1942' and the symphony concerts. There are more, but these are the only ones I've attended. New York City—Alfred B. Yeomans of Southern Pines, N. C., has "adopted" Rose Keenan, 11-year-old British girl through the Foster Parents' Plan for War Children, it was announced by Mrs. Edna Blue, executive chairman.

The child will be cared for at one of the 25 children's sanctuaries operated by the Plan, whose American headquarters are at 55 West 42nd street.

"The daughter of a Leeds coal miner, Rose has been afflicted with tuberculosis but since arriving at our colony is not as pale and wan as she was," Mrs. Blue said. "The Keenan's home was damaged during an air raid five, shy smile."

She is a pretty girl, with an attractive smile, and she is being cared for on the post, or in St. Louis almost every night. So you can see we aren't at a loss as far as entertainment goes.

"I will go to Denver, Colo., where I will enter the Air Corps Technical school at Lowry Field to study clerical work. It's a 16-week course, and upon graduation, I will be sent to a permanent base where I will remain until my three years have been completed.

"The Army has improved me physically as well as mentally," the Grover boy stated, "and I hope that when I return to Southern Pines, I will be a better citizen than I was when I left. My best wishes to every one."

The statement from young Grover, who is well known around Southern Pines, was made on a special form prepared by the Army's public relations division and filled out by him.

In the Kitchen With Katie Cook

Recently you learned how to fix Chicken Creole and Rice. This week we have another recipe for chicken. It's an old Southern recipe for Chicken Pie and was submitted by Mrs. E. L. Harris, of Raleigh.

Chicken Pie

Make pastry and leave in refrigerator to chill thoroughly.

Cook chicken until very well done. Take meat off the bones. Roll pastry to usual thickness for pie crust and place around the top of pie pan or baking dish, not putting pie crust on bottom of dish to avoid soggy. Place cut up chicken in dish and add butter, a little flour to thicken and some of the water the chicken is cooked in. Season to taste. Cook in a medium oven until pastry is brown.

Cranberry Sauce

Cranberry sauce is good with any kind of meat or meat pie and here is a recipe that's easy and good.

4 cups (1 lb.) Cranberries.
2 cups boiling water.
Boil 20 minutes. Strain. Add 2 cups sugar. Cook 5 minutes. Pour into molds. Cool and then place in refrigerator.

Pumpkin Pie

Now what about a dessert? For those who like Pumpkin Pie, here's a good recipe.

1 cup fresh or canned pumpkin.
1-2 cups boiled milk (canned milk may be used.)
1-2 cup sugar.
2 eggs.
1 tsp. flour.
1-4 tsp. cloves.
1-4 tsp. cinnamon.
Ginger.

If you prefer frozen desserts, try Frozen Lemon Pudding.

3 eggs.
1 cup sugar.
4 tbsp. lemon juice.
1-2 pt. cream whipped.
1 small box vanilla wafers.
Beat egg yolks. Add lemon juice and sugar. Cook in double boiler until thick; cool. Add egg whites beaten and then whipped cream. Cover freezing tray with vanilla wafer crumbs and pour on mixture. Cover top with crumbs and freeze.

Soldier Is Injured in Hit-Run Accident

John Hutson, reported as a private attached to the 152nd Observation Squadron at Fort Bragg, received a broken leg and serious cuts and bruises when struck by a hit-and-run driver, while he was walking along West Broad street, near the intersection of route 1, South of town.

His companions were unable to identify the offending car, officers here said, and Hutson was taken to Moore County Hospital for treatment, then removed to an Army hospital at Fort Bragg.

The unidentified automobile was headed toward Southern Pines, swung around the truck, and struck Hutson, according to officers. There has been no trace found of the hit-run driver or automobile.
