

COMMISSIONERS MAKE TAX DEEDS

Several Former Orders Rescinded by County Board; New Deeds Authorized

Monday's meeting of the Moore County Commissioners, which was attended by every member of the Board, was taken up with rescinding former orders in regard to property sold for taxes and authorizing W. H. Currie, trustee, to execute deeds for such lands.

Those rescinded were: Order of Aug. 4 authorizing deed made to E. W. McRae; order of October 6 authorizing deed to Tempie Colvin Estate, 40 acres Patterson Branch, to Will McKeithen, Sandhill township; order of October 6 deeding property of Joe Thomas Estate to Jim Murchison.

Overseer) for the one-third Daniel Vamper Estate, consideration \$43.34; to Edwin J. Neldenger for Tempie Colvin Estate 40 acres Patterson Branch, Sandhill township, consideration \$200; to Mary Cassady for the Fred McCrimmon Estate 1 lot Sandhill township, consideration \$75.

McGreggor lot Sandhill township, consideration \$50; to Clarence Whitley for 10 acres Mineral Springs township, James McLaughlin property, consideration \$50; to Willie and Edward Cooley for lots 59 and 60, Good map, property of John Taylor, Sandhill township, consideration \$60.

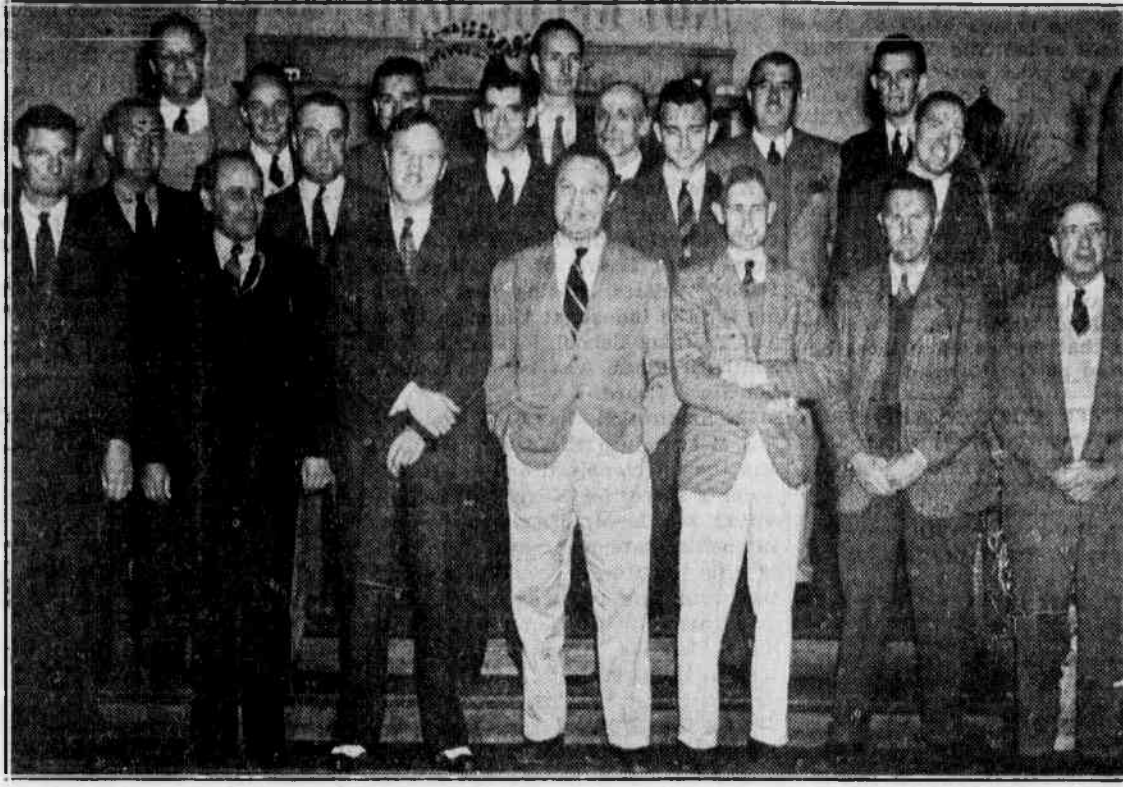

It was ordered that the valuation of H. E. Wall's property in Greenwood township be reduced for 1941 on account of the removal of timber; that "Red" Salmon's tract of land consisting of eight acres be segregated from J. S. Shields' 90 acres and that he be allowed to pay taxes on the eight acres separately in the amount of \$10.45 which covers all back taxes on said tract.

William Hubert Coburn of Williamston, widely known in eastern North Carolina and brother of Mrs. W. A. Moore of Southern Pines, died last Friday night in a Rocky Mount hospital, following a short illness. He was 38 years old.

Former prosecuting attorney in the Williamston Recorder's Court, Mr. Coburn was judge of the court at the time of his death. He studied at the University of North Carolina and at Wake Forest. His sister, Mrs. Moore, accompanied by Mr. Moore, attended funeral services, held Sunday.

Fort Bragg, N. C.—One week ago Orville D. Fulp of Ellerbe, N. C., was a private in the Quartermaster Corps—the Army's "housekeeper."
