

Indians On War Path For Tourists Scalps

The drums are quiet among the Cherokee Indians . . . but they're still after scalps, tourist scalps. The Cherokees, long a featured attraction for tourists in Western North Carolina, have decided to capitalize on the travel trade by setting up modern tourist cabins. So says Joe Jennings, acting superintendent of the Qualia Reservation.

Last November the Indians decided at a tribal meeting to profit from the influx of tourists who are pouring into the little village of Cherokee over the Blue Ridge Parkway. They will also produce genuine souvenirs baskets, pottery, and beadwork for sale to the visitors.

Plans are afoot to build twenty cottages for tourists in a section of the Indian land located adjacent to the Great Smoky Mountain National Park. The start of actual construction work is only awaiting Federal approval of a \$150,000.00 loan, which the Cherokees have requested to see them through the project.

Other tourist attractions might eventually be made available with the cottages, including a dining room, tennis courts, an archery range, and other recreational facilities. Site of the development will be a short distance off the main Park thoroughfare, and an access road is to be built leading to the cot-
