Effective July 29 and August 4, 1946

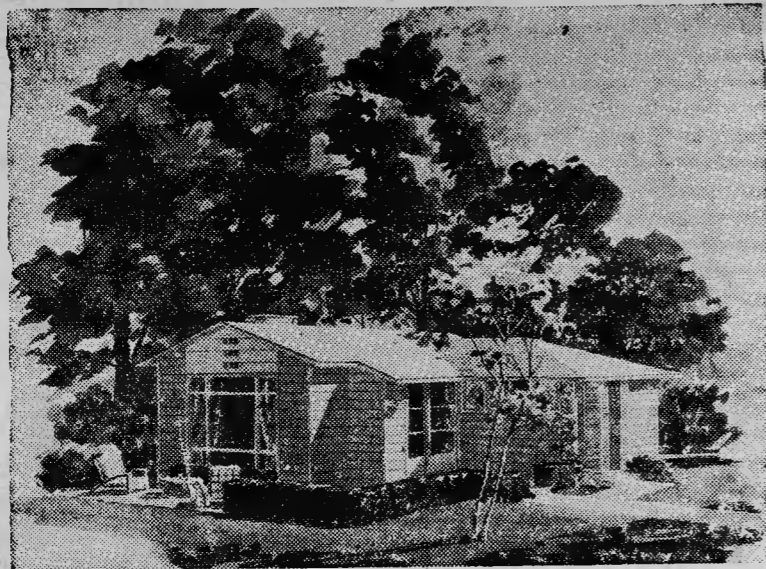
