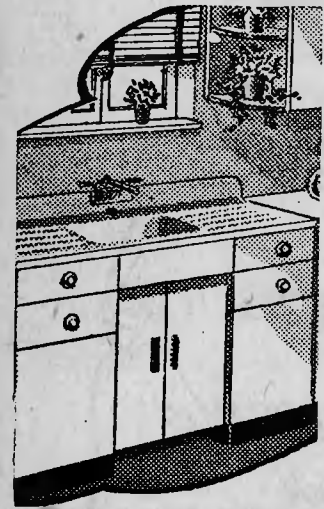

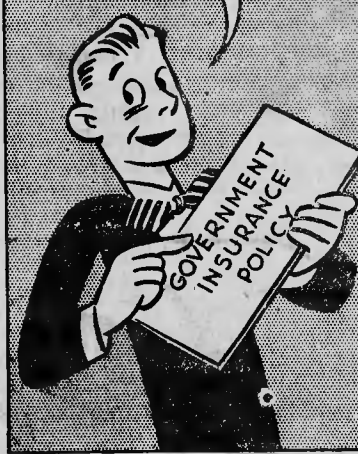

7,589 vacancies exist for reserve and national guard officers who desire to volunteer for an unlimited length of time or for 12, 18, or 24 months periods.
