Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Bullard Jr. of Laurinburg, spent Sunday with G.E.Walker.

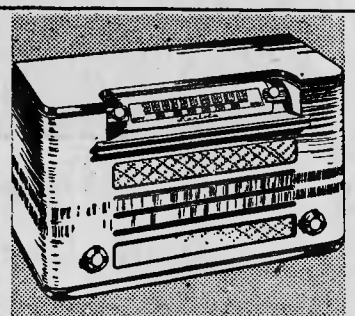

best qualified persons for public office.

Second: To stimulate full participation in local government by the citizens of Moore County through the medium of the ballot box and to that end to encourage the registration of all eligible voters.

Third: To urge the representatives of Moore County in the general assembly to support all measures: (1) looking toward the improvement of farm to market or secondary roads, (2) and providing for increase of salaries to the teachers in the public schools. Consideration should be given to the feasibility of increasing teachers' salaries from the general funds of the county.

Fourth: To encourage a broader and more far-reaching public health program with enlarged medical and hospital facilities in Moore County.

Fifth: To encourage air traffic to and from Moore County and, to that end, to develop and im-

prove the facilities at Knollwood Field.

Sixth: to promote a program for greater safety on the highways of the county and state.

Seventh: To support all efforts made in the establishment in Moore County of the headquarters on the United Nations.

The local group plans a meeting for October 25th, at which they will be host to the G. I. Democrat Clubs of the Eighth District. Officers of the organization are: County Chairman, Jere McKeithen, Aberdeen; vice chairman, W. A. Johnson, West End; secretary and treasurer, J. B. McLeod, Carthage.
