### Pianist Tureck To Perform At Flora Macdonald Soon

Rosalyn Tureck, brilliant young American pianist, who will appear at Flora Macdonald College on Monday evening, November 18, at 8:15, as the first artist of the 1946-47 concert and lecture series, has risen, at the age of 31, to the very peak of piano achievement, according to all critics, and is listed as "one of the greatest living interpreters of Bach." 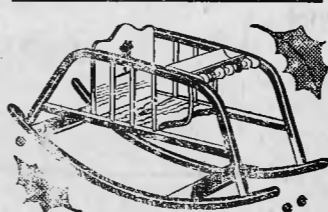
