All the elements of a successful, unsophisticated comedy, including lavish sets, smart dresses and the inimitable antics of S. Z. Sakall, are embodied in this fast moving film about a divorced couple whose child is made unhappy by their separation, and the little girl, played by Patti Brady, who manages to reunite her parents turns in a top performance.

Sunrise

With that literary bonanza—a best-seller—taking on increasingly greater importance in Hollywood's motion picture plans, the presentation of "Black Beauty" which plays Tuesday at the Sunrise Theatre, takes on extra special significance. For when it comes to "best-sellers", no novel in all literary history can put a candle to "Black Beauty." Next to the Bible it has had the widest distribution in the world. More than five million copies were sold in the United States alone, and the current filmization of the best-loved best-seller of them all, featuring an outstanding cast headed by Mona Freeman, Richard Denning, Evelyn Ankers and Charles Evans, is the signal for the appearance of three new editions to thrill countless new readers with its great and heart-warming story.

"Black Beauty" was written in 1877 by Anna Sewell, an aged and crippled spinster, whose only release from an isolated existence was through her horses. Through her exciting and charming story, she succeeded in bringing to all mankind a sorely-needed understanding of and sympathy for animals—especially horses. Following the revolutionary novels of Charles Dickens, which

did so much to correct human unkindness in England, "Black Beauty" swiftly brought a wave of reform legislation designed to improve the lot of dumb animals. So great and heartwarming was its story that the book soon found its way into every home that boasted a bookshelf, and became as necessary a part of every school library as the dictionary itself.

In bringing "Black Beauty" to the screen, Producer Edward L. Alperson has thereby followed the original novel, retaining the picturesque rural English locale of the closing years of the last century. Mona Freeman, who scored a sensation in "Junior Miss," is seen as the young English girl who owns Black Beauty. Richard Denning is the romantic young American; Evelyn Ankers appears as Lady Evelyn. Also featured in the film, an Alson Production directed by Max Nosseck and released by 20th Century-Fox, are Charles Evans, J. M. Kerrigan, Moyna Macgill and Terry Kilburn.

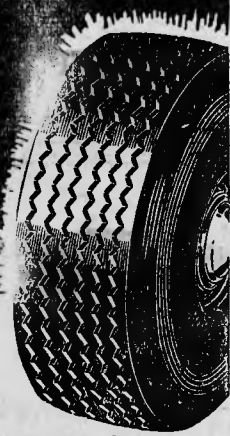

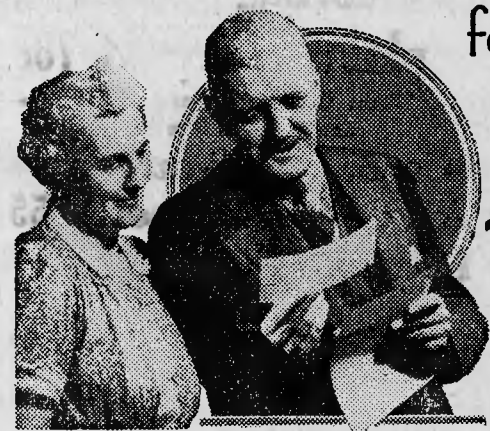

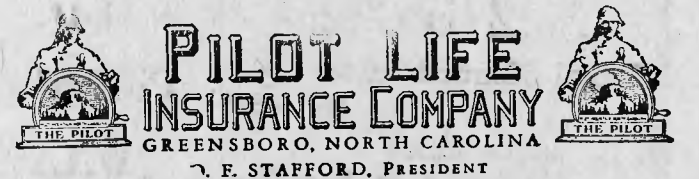
