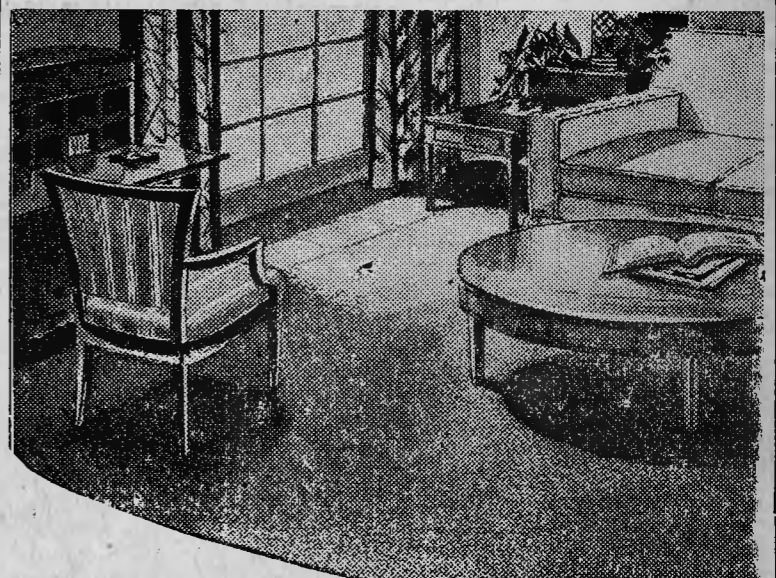

Notice of City License Tags

January 31st, 1950 is the dead line for obtaining your Southern Pines Motor Vehicle License Plates for 1950 from the City Clerk's Office of Southern Pines. Every resident owner of a motor vehicle operated in the Town except motor vehicles temporarily operated for a period of time not exceeding a total of thirty (30) days, and except motor vehicles operated for car display or car exhibition purposes by car manufacturers or dealers, displaying dealer's license plates issued by the State of North Carolina, shall register such vehicle with the Town Registrar of Motor Vehicles, at the Office of the City Clerk.

Every motor vehicle operated on the streets of the Town for which registration is required, shall throughout the current year display the assigned Town number plate in such manner in front or rear as to be visible at all times.

The fee for registration and number plate is One (\$1.00) Dollar, not prorated.
