fee basis, and returns of late years are generally considered to have run somewhat higher. Miss McCaskill's retention of the post would mean taking a pay cut with no chance of a raise until a new law could be passed.

The bill putting both these offices on salary as of December 1, 1946, was introduced by Senator W. H. Currie in the General Assembly of 1943, was passed and put on the statute books. In 1945, Senator Currie amended his bill to postpone the effective date to December 1, 1950.

Miss McCaskill's decision not to run caught the county short with no candidates in the field, as the possibility of dislodging the well-liked Miss McCaskill seemed too remote. With April 15 as the deadline for filing, it remains to be seen whether the salary will tempt anyone near her equal in efficiency.

Clerk of Court
The office of clerk of court will also go on a salary basis December 1, with the pay set at "not less than \$3,600 nor more than \$5,000," again at the commissioner's discretion. This also is considered to make a cut in money return certain for whoever gets the job.

the campaign at the end of April. To enter the parade, children will have to pass a test on bicycle safety rules. All bicycles will be checked for mechanical defects during the month.

Attractive literature, containing an effective message, will be distributed to the children and mimeographed messages sent home by them to the parents, containing reminders of safety rules regarding school buses, walking

on highways, etc. As a starter, safety leaflets will go out to each home with the water bills of April 1.

Some good speakers are being lined up to present the safety message to the youngsters, and films have been ordered for special programs.

Arrangements have been made for the showing of safety "trailers" at both the Carolina and Sunrise theatres during the month.

Each elementary teacher will have a "safety unit" during April, coordinating safety training with one or more of the regular subjects taught.
