

Lloyd Woolley Is Peabody Graduate, Wins High Honor

Lloyd L. Woolley, Jr., graduating last Wednesday night from the Conservatory of Music of the Peabody Institute, Baltimore, Md., was the recipient of one of the highest honors awarded in the class—the \$100 Harold Randolph prize "for studentship and musical achievement."

Mr. Woolley was one of 12 graduates in school music, winning the bachelor of music degree after four years of study at Peabody. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. L. L. Woolley of Southern Pines. A graduate of Southern Pines High school, he attended Duke university for one semester, then entered the U. S. Navy and served for three years during the war. He was on the Ticonderoga throughout her historic tour of duty in the South Pacific theatre.

He is married to the former Miss Carol Thomas, daughter of Mrs. Bert Thomas and the late Mr. Thomas of Southern Pines.

William Schuman, composer and president of the Juilliard School of Music in New York City, was the commencement speaker for the Peabody finals, held at Concert hall in Baltimore.

Pelton, '02, Attends Alumni Reunion Of Historic Biltmore Forestry School

P. P. Pelton, Southern Pines attorney, took part last weekend in what must certainly have been one of the most unusual events of the year for North Carolina.

This was a reunion of graduates of the Biltmore Forestry school, first forestry school ever held in the United States, which was conducted on the Vanderbilt estate near Asheville, from 1898 to 1912. Head of the school was Dr. Carl A. Schenck, a German, imported by the Vanderbilts as forester for Biltmore estate, and, says Mr. Pelton, "one of the most brilliant men I ever knew."

Finding no forestry available in this country for young Americans, Dr. Schenck started his own school giving an intensive one-year course to selected young men.

One of these was Mr. Pelton, who on graduation in 1902, went to Colorado to practice his new profession, but found it too rugged for the state of his health at that time and later turned to the study of law.

He had seen none of his fellow graduates of the Biltmore school until last weekend, when some who had been writing to each other carried through an idea they had had for some time. They met at Asheville. They visited Biltmore, where they had worked and studied so happily 40 or 50 years ago. They went together on a trip into the high mountains, to see and enjoy again together the forest they had loved—finding it no longer a wilderness, but a well-marked-out recreation area.

In a deep mountain glen, "Pinkhead Valley," still untouched in its natural beauty, they affixed a bronze plaque to a boulder in honor of their teacher, Dr. Schenck.

Perhaps the most remarkable part of the story is that Dr. Schenck is still living, in Germany. His former students are all writing him about the reunion, and he will receive a picture of the bronze plaque.

They can also tell him—except that he no doubt already knows—that his small forestry school inspired other, greater ones in colleges and universities of the United States, as his graduates went out fired with new knowledge and eager to spread the forestry gospel. To them, and to Dr. Schenck, may probably be directly traced the growth of forestry as a science and a profession of high standing in this country today.

Some 35 graduates attended the reunion last weekend, of more than 100 believed to be still living. They came from California, Maine, Georgia and all states between. They had stories to tell of their careers, many of them spent in the lumber business or other forestry-related industry, or in the government service where their knowledge was of great value.

A number of the alumni, including Mr. Pelton, were accompanied by their wives.

Brikerete Co. Is New Business For Southern Pines

A new corporation for Moore county has been formed for the manufacture of concrete brick by patented process.

Operating as the Mid-South Brikerete company, the corporation has acquired a site for the plant on U. S. Highway 1, just outside the northern city limits of Southern Pines, from Ralph Chandler.

Domnick T. Difatta, for many years in the employ of W. C. Fownes, Jr., of Knollwood, is secretary-treasurer and general manager of the company. John Beasley of Carthage is president and V. P. Johnson of Southern Pines is vice-president.

The company has the Brikerete franchise for Moore, Lee, Richmond, Chatham and Montgomery counties and an option on other nearby counties.

Brikeretes, claimed ideal for both business and residential construction, are made in a variety of colors, including red, green and old gold. They are waterproof, and are expected to sell at a price cheaper than lumber. In fact, the necessary brikeretes for the exterior and interior walls of a five-room house will cost under \$500, according to the advance report.

Orders for the necessary machinery have been placed and Mr. Difatta says he hopes to have the plant in operation within 60 days.
