# WILLIS SMITH and THE PEOPLE versus ALL THE MACHINES

## Willis Smith versus All The Machines; Second Primary Race Is On

Willis Smith has decided to do what Kerr Scott did two years ago. He has called for a second primary election after being second man in the first election.

Two years ago Kerr Scott stirred the imagination of North Carolina voters by refusing to quit just because he was trailing a few thousand votes in the eighth inning of the great game of politics.

He remembered that old baseball adage that the game is never over until the last out has been made in the ninth inning. And Kerr Scott refused to surrender to the Machine. He staged a ninth rally that defeated the Machine and won the Governorship.

Willis Smith in effect is telling the people of North Carolina that he too can beat the Machine in the ninth inning. Only Smith has more than one Machine to defeat.

He has to unhorse a collection of Machines that make strange political bedfellows, but pretty good vote getters.

He has to defeat that machine which is built around the loyalty of University of North Carolina alumni to Frank Graham; he has to defeat the machine that Kerr Scott has constructed and which is known today as the State administration; he has to defeat the National Democratic political machine, which is potent in North Carolina through the distribution of patronage; he has to defeat the CIO Political Action Committee; and he has to defeat the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

On his side he has an army of some quarter-million North Carolinians, who are just as untterrified of machines as Willis Smith.

He has an army of a quarter-million North Carolinians who believe in God and Country, who believe in traditional Americanism.

Willis Smith believes that with this army of loyal, patriotic America-loving Tar Heels on his side, that all the cunning, all the political strategems and all the vast wealth of all the machines, will not prevail against him—that he can win and that he will win.
